


Puerto Rico Views on Status & The Political Parties

Results from a poll of 800 voters in Puerto Rico, conducted from August 23-28, 2025.



Puerto Ricans have positive feelings toward Pablo José Hernández Rivera and the Democratic Party, and are negative to Juan Dalmau. Views toward Jenniffer González, Trump, and the GOP are very negative.


How do you feel about each of the following groups or people?





Party identification is split evenly between the PPD and the PNP.






Among those with positive feelings toward the Democratic Party, nearly half identify as PPDers, while a majority of those with positive feelings toward the Republican Party identify as PNPers.



Majorities of Puerto Ricans believe that Commonwealth is a viable status and that Statehood and Independence are not. Pro-Commonwealth views are even stronger among Democratic supporters.
